

The Division of Child Advocacy at University of Pittsburgh Medical Center (UPMC) Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh is seeking a BC/BE Child Abuse Pediatrician to join the Child Advocacy team. The candidate will join eight other faculty members in a highly respected Division of Child Advocacy. Rank and salary will be commensurate with experience.

This position is in a hospital-based National Children's Alliance (NCA) accredited child advocacy center which serves a 23-county region of Western Pennsylvania, as well as several counties in Eastern Ohio and West Virginia. The medical staff evaluate children with suspected physical abuse, sexual abuse, and neglect in inpatient and outpatient settings. There are numerous opportunities for teaching an array of learners, including trainees, medical staff, and community partners. In 2025, the medical team evaluated approximately 300 inpatients, the forensic interviewing team performed over 600 forensic interviews, and the outpatient clinic (which provides follow-up care to inpatients as well as outpatient evaluations for abuse and neglect) evaluated over than 2000 children. Opportunities abound for research, continued development of clinical services, academic pursuits, and advancement of professional growth.

UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh is among the top children's hospitals in the nation. UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh is a 315-bed, free-standing children's hospital which is a regional Level 1 Trauma Center located in the Lawrenceville neighborhood of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Pittsburgh has a rich cultural heritage, diverse neighborhoods, superb public transportation, and multiple institutions of higher learning. UPMC Children's Hospital cares for over 80% of all hospitalized children in a large catchment area which includes Western Pennsylvania, Eastern Ohio, Northern West Virginia, and Southwestern New York. Overlooking the Allegheny River and much of the metropolitan area, the hospital is minutes away from the downtown cultural district, home stadiums for three major sports teams, an internationally recognized culinary scene, and renowned centers of higher education.
