The Child Abuse Research Education and Service (CARES) Institute at Rowan University-SOM is seeking a 6th Child Abuse Pediatrics (CAP) BC/BE pediatrician who desires to build an exciting and fulfilling career in child abuse and neglect.

The CARES Institute is a University designated Center of Excellence and a statewide resource

to inform best practices in the delivery of medical and mental health services to maltreated children. As a faculty member there is ample opportunity to actively participate in undergraduate and graduate medical education, program development and clinical research. The Institute is the only dedicated diagnostic and treatment resource for the southern 1/3 of the state of New Jersey and was designated by the State of New Jersey as a Regional Child Abuse Diagnostic Center. Institute staff consists of over 60 full time professionals providing medical and mental health services; community outreach, legislative advocacy, training and NIMH funded research. Outpatient evaluations for child sexual and physical abuse are conducted at our facility on our main campus. As the regions only child abuse diagnostic and treatment center, faculty participate in county-based multidisciplinary teams, convene the regional child death review team, provide professional training to child protective services, law enforcement and the courts.

This position provides an excellent opportunity for a clinician to develop a solid clinical and/or research career in child abuse. The candidate will receive an academic appointment at either an assistant/associate professor level in the Department of Pediatrics. Child Protection Team Medical Director

The Howard Phillips Center for Children & Families is a division of Arnold Palmer Hospital, which is part of Orlando Health, a not-for-profit hospital system founded in 1918. The Howard Phillips Center for Children & Families brings together six programs providing services to strengthen children and families in Central Florida. Three of those programs make up the Children's Advocacy Center. The Children's Advocacy Center provides services associated with the assessment, advocacy and therapeutic treatment of child abuse in one child-friendly location.

The Child Protection Team provides the upfront assessment services of the Children's Advocacy Center to aid the Department of Children and Families and law enforcement in assessing child abuse and neglect. The Child Protection Team is comprised of physicians, advanced practitioner registered nurses, and case coordinators who provide a variety of medical and social assessments culminating in recommendations being made for the protection and ongoing wellness of the child and family.

Position Job Duties

Qualifications:

Must be a Florida licensed physician under Chapters 458 or 459, F.S. who is:

(1) A board-certified Pediatrician and who, within four (4) years following the date of employment, either (a) obtains a sub-specialty certification from the American Board of Pediatrics in Child Abuse Pediatrics or (b) meets the requirements established by a third-party credentialing entity recognizing demonstrated specialized competence in child abuse

or

(2) A board-certified Family Physician who, within 2 (two) years following the date of employment, meets the requirements established by a third-party credentialing entity recognizing demonstrated specialized competence in child abuse.

Responsibilities and Duties:

- Provide medical evaluations of children. Supervise and review the work of the team's medical practitioners.
- Ensure medical coverage availability 24 hours a day, seven days a week for consultation as well as for direct medical assessment. Direct medical assessments occur on-site at The Howard Phillips Center for Children & Families, at the Children's Advocacy Center Osceola, as well as at local hospitals in Orange and Osceola counties.
- Assure medical representation for team staffings.
- Arrange for and provide in-service training and other professional development for team staff and medical personnel.
- Assist the statewide CPT Medical Director in the planning and provision of training for regional and statewide training sessions.
- Participate as a committee member (or appoint a medical designee) in the local Child Abuse Death Review (CADR) Committee.
- Annually, plan and conduct a minimum of two training sessions in the detection of child abuse and neglect for area physicians and other medical staff.
- Ensure a peer review process is in place and documented, at a minimum, for all sexual abuse cases with abnormal findings.
- Attend statewide child protection team meetings and other meetings and training sessions as required to maintain the knowledge and skills required for this position.
- Provide depositions and expert court testimony when appropriate.
- Successful completion of a minimum of eight hours of medical training per year in child abuse, abandonment, and neglect.
- Serve on the DCF Critical Incident Rapid Response Team (CIRRT) if appointed.
- Other duties as assigned.

Description

The University of Chicago's Department of Pediatrics, Section of Academic Pediatrics, is searching for a child abuse pediatrician. The successful applicant will be a full-time faculty

member, contribute to patient care, medical education, and scholarship, and join a vibrant, diverse, and distinguished community of faculty colleagues and students and:

- Provide consultation within an established interdisciplinary process and participate in court-related activities as needed.
- Support the Multidisciplinary Pediatric Education and Evaluation Consortium (MPEEC) program by providing real-time expert medical consultation to child welfare and law enforcement for a mandated population of children who are reported for serious harm. The program is managed by University of Chicago Comer Children's Hospital Child Advocacy and Protective Services (CAPS) program staff, and case coordination is supported by a full-time MPEEC investigations coordinator. MPEEC is a national landmark program and has received state support for over 18 years.
- Train pediatric residents during the required one-month rotation, which includes morning reports, grand rounds, medical school courses and the MPEEC quarterly seminars.
- Provide lectures and grand rounds to regional hospitals and medical centers, as well as community partners such as state's attorneys, law enforcement and child welfare investigators.
- Participate in hospital committee efforts such as QI projects and programmatic and policy development related to child abuse medicine.

Scholarship in child abuse pediatrics is an expectation; opportunities and responsibilities within the University and Medical Center will be tailored to the talents and interests of the successful applicant. Academic rank and compensation (including a generous package of fringe benefits) are dependent upon qualifications.

Child Abuse Pediatrician - University of Texas Health Science Center

The University of Texas Health Science Center at Tyler is creating a Child Abuse Center which will work with existing community agencies (e.g., child advocacy centers) to serve the

multidisciplinary needs of abused children and their non-offending caretaker. We are seeking a full time BC/BE Child Abuse pediatrician or pediatrician with significant interest in serving children who are suspected victims of child maltreatment to join the newly formed Department of Pediatrics. The Center will focus on training clinical skills with multiple disciplines including physicians, psychologists, psychiatrists, social workers, and licensed professional counselors. Clinical work will occur through collaboration with other community agencies, on the campus of the health science center, and at other select clinic sites in the region. In addition to clinical work and training, the position includes an academic appointment, so there is the expectation that the successful candidate will work with other Center faculty, UTHSCT faculty, and experts across the nation to develop innovative programs and research initiatives.

The Center will be funded through a legislative initiative to increase services to these underserved, abused children in the East Texas region. Tyler is a medium-sized city serving the medical and mental health needs of the rural East Texas region, with a patient population of close to 1.3 million. Tyler itself is home to the Health Science Center and two major medical institutions.
